As part of our Library's efforts to respond to your use of our collections, we're making some changes to where some materials are shelved.




We've moved the first floor graphic novel collection across the aisle to provide more shelving space for this growing collection and we've added more shelving space for books-on-CD as well to allow for more growth for this popular collection.

Sheet music and other music books have been moved upstairs.

To help reduce operating costs and maintain a high level of public service, we are experimenting with moving reserved materials from behind the Circulation Desk and into a public self-serve area near the front doors of the Library.

the treasure that is the West Lafayette Public Library.


I want to thank every Friend who has donated time, energy, and finances to our organization.

Notes from Nick Schenkel, WLPL Director

It's an exciting time to visit our West Lafayette Public Library! The West Lafayette Public Library board and staff have embarked on a journey that will see the Library focus on adapting and changing over the next several years, with significant updates and possibly even new construction (the latter is still being considered).



It's clear that the Library is growing into a becoming a valued third place for our community – a place which, in addition to your home and your workplace, you're encouraged to spend time enriching your life. And so as our collections and services see steady and growing use by you and other members of our community, we need to adapt our library to reflect the times in which we live.

The rough outlines of these adaptations are coming into view – but they remain malleable and open to change; with that in mind here are highlights of the Library's likely evolution over the next several Years....

Better access to our book, music and video collections – both in-kind and electronic. A perusal of our Library's annual reports for the past few years show a trajectory that is pushing children's and teen reading to new levels while use of the adult collections (especially new books and fiction) continue to be Strong.

Meeting and study spaces need to increase in both their number and ease of scheduling use. Again, a perusal of our annual reports shows that more and more folks are using our Library for meetings – from community sponsored meetings to larger and larger library

sponsored family programs – and for studying in groups small and large.

Deeper integration into the West Lafayette's re-developing downtown and into residential West Lafayette.

As more and more of us discover the joy of exploring the exciting shops, dining and government services in the Village and Levee areas of West Lafayette our Library is pivoting to offer ready access to our parking and grounds areas so that your visits to the Village area in particular are more fun and more Productive.

Too, we know the Library needs to continue expanding the Library's reach into our community's residential neighborhoods – through our active little free library program, our growing number of book-drop-off locations and our visits to local early education and senior centers.

I know the members of the Library Board join me and other member of the Library staff in thanking everyone who participated in the well attended charrettes we offered last Fall; those public sessions are continuing to provide valued input for planning the Library's future.

Please continue to let us know how we can make the West Lafayette Public Library a valued part of your and your family's lives. Together we can continue a bright future for our public library!
