




If donating financially is not feasible, please consider helping us succeed in our mission to support WLPL Library through volunteerism.

### Notes from Nick Schenkel, WLPL Director



The Library's building and grounds will see significant changes in the next couple of years, changes intended to improve access to current popular collections and services and introduce a couple of new opportunities for learning and fun at the Library as we approach 100 years of service!

A bustling, expanded first floor is a key part of the new floor plans now under consideration.

Joining the first floor's offerings will be an expanded teen room with more space for the growing teen book and media collections as well as study and lounge space. A new "creative" room will encourage Library visitors (and staff) to become doers and makers.

A public meeting to introduce the plans and to accept comments on them will take place on Thursday, March 26 at 6:30 pm

The Library's second floor will continue to offer meeting rooms, capacious seating and study

areas that look out over the Village area, and house the Library's nonfiction collections as well as a number of new smaller study/meeting rooms.

The parking garage will soon sport a new set of entry/exit gates that will offer better service for our many library patrons.

All library garage visitors will be offered one hour of free parking in the garage. Those folks visiting the Library will have access to validated free parking during regular library open hours.

Others who choose to use the garage but not necessarily the Library will be charged for parking after their one free hour of parking is expired, with a maximum daily charge; all rates will be posted on kiosks at the garage entrance.


